## Psalm 124 – **The Lord is on our side**



## **GETTING STARTED**

This Psalm splits nicely into two halves. What changes in v6?

## 1) WHAT IF HE WASN'T? (v1-5)

What illustrations does David use to make his point? We're not given a specific situation but what sort of thing does David have in mind?

Why the repetition in v1 and v2?

What does it look like for us to sing this song? How does it apply today? (See Eph 6v12 / 1 Peter 5v8 / Acts 27v27-44)

2) PRAISE GOD HE IS! (v6-8)
What prompts the praise in v6? Chat through the picture that David paints for us
We have a greater deliverance to praise God for
Check out Romans 8v1-2 and talk about the language of being set free
See also Romans 8v31-32. How does that encourage you?
What does this mean for those who haven't trusted Jesus? Reflect back on Psalm
124
How does the declaration in v8 capture the main thrust of the whole Psalm?

Meditate on the words of Paul below...

**Rom 8v31:** What, then, shall we say in response to these things? If God is for us, who can be against us?
