- The Plot to Assassinate Xerxes
- The Plot to Annihilate the Jews

1) The Plot to Assassinate Xerxes

2v21: During the time Mordecai was sitting at the king's gate, Bigthana and Teresh, two of the king's officers who guarded the doorway, <u>became angry</u> <u>and conspired to assassinate King</u> <u>Xerxes</u>.

1) The Plot to Assassinate Xerxes

2v22: <u>Mordecai found out about the</u> <u>plot</u> and told Queen Esther, who in turn reported it to the king, giving credit to Mordecai.

1) The Plot to Assassinate Xerxes

2v23: And when the report was investigated and found to be true, the two officials were impaled on poles. <u>All this was recorded</u> in the book of the annals in the presence of the king.

3v1: After these events, King Xerxes honoured Haman son of Hammedatha, the Agagite, <u>elevating him</u> and giving him a seat of honour higher than that of all the other nobles.



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3v2: All the royal officials at the king's gate knelt down and paid honour to Haman, for the king had commanded this concerning him. <u>But Mordecai</u> would not kneel down or pay him honour.

3v5: When Haman saw that Mordecai would not kneel down or pay him honour, <u>he was enraged</u>.



3v6: <u>Yet having learned who Mordecai's</u> <u>people were</u>, he scorned the idea of killing only Mordecai. Instead Haman looked for a way to destroy all Mordecai's people, the Jews, throughout the whole kingdom of Xerxes.

3v7: In the twelfth year of King Xerxes, in the first month, the month of Nisan, the *pur* (that is, the lot) was cast in the presence of Haman to select a day and month. <u>And the lot fell on the twelfth</u> month, the month of Adar.

Destruction of every living Jew

3v13: Dispatches were sent by couriers to all the king's provinces with the **order** to destroy, kill and annihilate all the Jews – young and old, women and children – on a single day, the thirteenth day of the twelfth month, the month of Adar...

3v15: The king and Haman sat down to drink, but the city of Susa was bewildered.



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Will we hide or will we stand?



3v12: Then on the <u>thirteenth day of the</u> <u>first month</u> the royal secretaries were summoned.



3v15: The king and Haman sat down to drink...

4v3: In every province to which the edict and order of the king came, <u>there was</u> great mourning among the Jews, with fasting, weeping and wailing. Many lay in sackcloth and ashes.

4v5: Then Esther summoned Hathak, one of the king's eunuchs assigned to attend her, and ordered him to <u>find out</u> <u>what was troubling Mordecai and why</u>.

4v8: ...he told him to instruct her to go into the King's presence to beg for mercy and to plead with him for her people



V11: 'All the king's officials and the people of the royal provinces know that for any man or woman who approaches the king in the inner court without being summoned the king has but one law: that they be put to death unless the king extends the gold sceptre to them and spares their lives.

4v15-16: Then Esther sent this reply to Mordecai: ¹⁶ 'Go, gather together all the Jews who are in Susa, and fast for me. Do not eat or drink for three days, night or day. I and my attendants will fast as you do. When this is done, I will go to the king, even though it is against the law. And if I perish, I perish.'
